

A. PRICING

1. PERFORMANCE WORK STATEMENT

The U.S. Consulate General, Chiang Mai has a requirement for a firm to provide fuel removal and delivery service for the new U.S. Consulate General Chiang Mai, 131 Moo 4, Chiangmai-Lampang Superhighway Road, Mueang, Chiang Mai, Thailand.

2. PRICE

2.1 The contractor shall complete all work; including furnishing all labor, material, equipment, and services required under this purchase order for the following firm fixed price and within the time specified. This price shall include all labor, materials, supplies, all insurances, overhead and profit.

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2.2 VALUE ADDED TAX

Value Added Tax (VAT) is not applicable to this contract and shall not be included in the CLIN rates or Invoices because the U.S. Embassy has a tax exemption certificate from the host government.

A VAT Exemption document will be processed through Ministry of Foreign Affairs for orders that which VAT exceeds 5,000 THB for local VAT registered contractors under Section 82/3 of Thai Revenue Code only. The contractor will receive the document within 150 days after submitting the invoice.

2.3 INVOICE AND PAYMENT

The Contractor shall submit an invoice after the completion of service. Invoices must be accompanied by a signed copy of the acceptance letter for the work performed.

The Contractor should expect payment 30 days after completion of service or 30 days after

receipt of invoice at the Consulate's payment office, whichever is later. Invoices shall be sent to ChiangmailInvoices@state.gov.

3. NOTICE TO PROCEED

3.1 After receiving and accepting any evidence of insurance, the Contracting Officer will provide a Notice to Proceed to the contractor. The contractor must then prosecute the work, commencing and completing performance not later than the period specified in the contract.

3.2 It is possible that the Contracting Officer may elect to issue the Notice to Proceed before the receipt and acceptance of any evidence of insurance. Issuance of the Notice to Proceed by the Government before receipt of the required insurance certificates or policies shall not be a waiver of the requirement to furnish these documents.

B. SCOPE OF WORK

The Contractor shall remove approximately 11,000 Liters of unleaded gasoline as well as deliver approximately 11,000 Liters of high-quality diesel fuel that complies with all local regulations and laws for the use of passenger vehicles and cargo vans. Contractor is to provide the tools, equipment, vehicles, containment, etc. to perform the work in a safe and effective manner. Removed gasoline fuel must be recycled and not dumped. The Contractor shall perform the work at the U.S. Consulate located at Moo 4, Chiang Mai – Lampang Superhighway Road, T. Nhongpakrang, Mueang, Chiang Mai. The Contractor shall perform the work following all local laws/regulations as well as following industry best practices for safety.

The contractor will comply with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Safety and Health Requirements Manual (EM 385-1-1). Prior to the commencement of the work, the contractor will submit a job safety analysis to Contracting Officer's Representative (COR). The contractor will identify all steps of the work, the hazards involved, how the hazards will be mitigated, worker personal protective equipment, etc. The contractor will also submit a step-by-step action plan for the work which the contractor's employees will follow.

The COR and Contractor will coordinate a date for removal and delivery. The removal and delivery must occur on the same day to prevent tank flotation. On the date of delivery, the Contractor will use a tanker truck and pump to remove the gasoline. During the work, the tanker truck, pump, hose, etc. shall be properly bonded to the Earth to prevent static discharge that may spark and cause a fire. All workers will use appropriate PPE including eye protection, chemical resistant gloves, Fire resistant clothing etc.

Immediately following the removal of the unleaded gasoline, the contractor will deliver the diesel fuel. The contractor will follow the approved safety plan. The refueling will be done with gravity flow and not pumped into the tank.

After the tank has been filled, the contractor will flush the fuel lines by running the vehicle fuel dispenser pump until diesel fuel is observed coming out of the pump. The remaining fuel can be placed back into the underground tanks. The contractor will be responsible for the disposal and transportation of fuel, sludge, and waste in accordance with local regulations.

C. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

The COR, or his/her authorized representatives, will inspect the services being performed under this contract to determine whether work is being performed in a satisfactory manner, and that all safety rules and plans are being followed.

The Contractor shall be responsible for any countermeasures or corrective action, within the scope of this contract, which may be required by the Contracting Officer as a result of such inspection.

Upon completion of the work, the contractor will provide an invoice to the COR, indicating the amount of fuel delivered.

D. DELIVERIES OR PERFORMANCE

The Contractor shall be required to (a) commence work under this contract on the date determined by the COR and agreed to by the Contractor, (b) prosecute the work diligently, and (c) complete the entire work in one day.

Working Hours

The work will be performed on the day approved by the COR and agree to by the contractor. The day selected will be a regular work day, Monday through Friday, between the hours of 0800 to 1600. Other hours, if requested by the Contractor, may be approved by the COR. Any change to the plan must be approved by the COR at least 24 hours in advance.

Pre-Work Conference

A conference will be held after contract award during regular work hours on a date to be determined by the COR at the U.S. Consulate General to discuss the schedule, submittals, notice to proceed, mobilization and other important issues that effect this contract.

Restricted business operations means business operations in Sudan that include power production activities, mineral extraction activities, oil-related activities, or the production of military equipment, as those terms are defined in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007 (Pub. L. 110-174). Restricted business operations do not include business operations that the person (as that term is defined in Section 2 of the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007) conducting the business can demonstrate—

- (1) Are conducted under contract directly and exclusively with the regional government of southern Sudan;
- (2) Are conducted pursuant to specific authorization from the Office of Foreign Assets Control in the Department of the Treasury, or are expressly exempted under Federal law from the requirement to be conducted under such authorization;

 - (i) A court within the United States is able to exercise primary supervision over the administration of the trust; and

(ii) One or more United States persons have the authority to control all substantial decisions of the trust.

(b) Unless exempted, there is a 2 percent tax of the amount of a specified Federal procurement payment on any foreign person receiving such payment. See 26 U.S.C. 5000C and its implementing regulations at 26 CFR 1.5000C-1 through 1.5000C-7.

(c) Exemptions from withholding under this provision are described at 26 CFR 1.5000C-1(d)(5) through (7). The Offeror would claim an exemption from the withholding by using the Department of the Treasury Internal Revenue Service Form W-14, Certificate of Foreign Contracting Party Receiving Federal Procurement Payments, available via the internet at www.irs.gov/w14. Any exemption claimed and self-certified on the IRS Form W-14 is subject to audit by the IRS.
