The U.S. government intends to award a contract/purchase order to the responsible company submitting an acceptable offer at the lowest price. Quotations are due by 4:00 PM August 07, 2025. No quotations will be accepted after this time. Quotations must be in English and incomplete quotations will not be accepted. Your quotation must be submitted electronically to Pinlaorp@state.gov. Please enter in the subject line: “Quotation Enclosed-RFQ#19TH2025Q0055 Replacement of R22 HVAC system in server room at 3rd and 5th Floor, GPF Building” It is important to make sure the submission is made in a specific size and format; in MS-Word 2007/2010 or MS-Excel 2007/2010 or Adobe Acrobat (pdf) file format. The file size must not exceed 30MB. If the file size exceeds 30MB, the submission must be made in separate files and attached to separate emails with less than 30MB each.

In order for a quotation to be considered, you must also complete and submit the following:

4. Additional information as required in Section J
5. Proof of SAM Registration

The contract type shall be firm-fixed price. A duration of this work shall be 30 calendar days.

A. PRICE

The Contractor shall complete all work, including furnishing all labor, material, equipment, and services required under this purchase order for the following firm fixed price and within the time specified. This price shall include all labor, materials, all insurances, overhead and profit.

A.2 VALUE ADDED TAX

Value Added Tax (VAT) is not applicable to this contract and shall not be included in the CLIN rates or Invoices because the U.S. Embassy has a tax exemption certificate from the host government.

SECTION B - STATEMENT OF WORK

The character and scope of the work are set forth in the contract. The Contractor shall furnish and install all materials required by this contract.

In case of differences between small and large-scale drawings, the latter will govern. Where a portion of the work is drawn in detail and the remainder of the work is indicated in outline, the parts drawn in detail shall apply also to all other portions of the work.

B.1 Background

The U.S. Embassy intends to award a contract to replace the existing R22 HVAC systems with new, efficient, and environmentally friendly systems. The existing systems are in the AHU rooms, and server rooms on the 3rd, and 5th floors of GPF Building Tower A, Wireless Road, Lumpini, Pathumwan, Bangkok, Thailand.

B.2 SCOPE OF WORK

The contractor shall provide certified equipment, tools and labor to replace the existing R22 HVAC systems.

Services to be performed by Contractor are described as follows:

3rd Floor Server Room:

- Safely remove and dispose of the existing R22 HVAC systems, including both FCU (Fan Coil Units), CDU (Condensing Units), refrigerant pipes, air ducts, air grilles and electrical equipment installed on the 3rd floor.
- Install two sets of new HVAC systems including condensate drain pumps, drainpipes and refrigerant pipes, each providing a cooling capacity of no less than the existing units at 36,000 BTU/HR each.
- Install new electrical equipment and controls for the new HVAC system.
- Relocate the CDU-01 with connected valves, pipes and accessories to the designed location.
- Ensure the new systems are compatible with the existing infrastructure and electrical systems.
- Ensure one unit will remain operational at all times until the replacement unit is fully functional, at which point that contractor will switch to the new unit and proceed with replacing the second unit.
- Perform manufacturer testing/commissioning accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, and the manufacturer checklist shall be submitted with the proposal package during the bidding process.
- Restore working areas and building infrastructures to normal conditions.
- Provide commissioning reports and documentation to confirm the systems meet the specified requirements. Provide training for relevant personnel on the operation and maintenance of the new HVAC systems.

- Provide all necessary documentation, including drawings, operation manuals, maintenance schedules, a list of spare parts and warranty information.

5th Floor Server Room:

- Safely remove and dispose of the existing R22 HVAC systems, including both FCU (Fan Coil Units), CDU (Condensing Units), refrigerant pipes, air ducts and electrical equipment installed on the 5th floor.
- Install two sets of new HVAC systems including drainpipes and refrigerant pipes, each providing a cooling capacity of no less than 36,000 BTU/HR.
- Install new electrical equipment and controls for the new HVAC system.
- Ensure the new systems are compatible with the existing infrastructure and electrical systems.
- Ensure one unit will remain operational at all times until the replacement unit is fully functional, at which point that contractor will switch to the new unit and proceed with replacing the second unit.
- Perform manufacturer testing/commissioning accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations, and the manufacturer checklist shall be submitted with the proposal package during the bidding process.
- Restore working areas and building infrastructures to normal conditions.
- Provide commissioning reports and documentation to confirm the systems meet the specified requirements. Provide training for relevant personnel on the operation and maintenance of the new HVAC systems.
- Provide all necessary documentation, including drawings, operation manuals, maintenance schedules, list of spare parts and warranty information.

Requirements:

- The contractor is responsible for coordinating with the GPF building management to obtain approval for this project. All shop drawings and necessary documents shall be provided by the contractor. All associated fees shall be paid by the contractor.
- The contractor shall provide insurance as required by the GPF building management and the US Embassy.
- The existing R22 system shall be carefully decommissioned and removed with R22 properly stored for disposal. Releasing R22 into the atmosphere is prohibited, and the contractor must provide an invoice from a certified company for its proper disposal.
- The contractor shall restore all areas affected by the project construction, including but not limited to ceiling work, etc.
- The new HVAC systems shall not use R22 refrigerant and should comply with current environmental regulations.
- All work shall be performed in accordance with Thailand building codes and standards.
- Work hours shall be during weekends and holidays. The work shall be completely done within four weekends.
- All work shall comply with the building requirements.

The Contractor shall provide a full-time experienced and certified Project Leader on site. The Contractor's Project Leader and other designated representatives will work closely and collaboratively with the Embassy for the relocation. The Project Leader is requested to be on site throughout the duration of each move. The Embassy reserves the right to approve/or reject the Project Leader designated to work with the Embassy. The Embassy also reserves the right to require the removal of any member of the Contractor's move team from the site.

Site Survey: The contractor shall visit Post accompanied by a Post Engineer to survey the site and its conditions including gather additional data during the site survey.

Site Restoration. The contractor shall restore the area around the construction area to the conditions before the construction. The work includes all utilities, and landscape.

Disposal of Materials Removed. The Contractor shall be responsible for the disposal of all removed materials that the Embassy does not want to maintain possession of. The contractor shall meet with the Embassy prior to commencement of work to determine where the materials to be disposed or shall be temporarily stored on site. The contractor shall ensure that all items removed through this work are disposed properly.

Safety. Safety is the highest priority on this and all OBO/OM/FAC projects. The contractor shall direct all of those under his charge to work safely. Regular safety meetings shall be held among on-site contractor personnel, and safety concerns shall immediately be brought to the attention of the Embassy.

The Contractor agrees and warrants that it and its workforce shall comply with applicable safety regulations. Further, all equipment used shall meet all requirements identified by the Embassy.

B.3 DELIVERABLES

- Removal and proper disposal of the old HVAC systems and all related equipment and materials.
- Installation of new HVAC systems with the specified cooling capacities.
- Comprehensive testing and commissioning reports.
- Training sessions and complete documentation for the new systems.

B.4 TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- Successful installation of HVAC systems with no less than the specified cooling capacities.
- Full compliance with environmental regulations and Thailand building codes.
- Completion of testing, commissioning, and training with satisfactory reports and documentation.
- All work shall be completed within the agreed timeline.
- Any deviations from the specified requirements shall be approved in writing by the Contracting Officer (CO)

- All equipment and materials used shall be new and of high quality.

B.5 TIMELINE

The Contractor shall submit documents for approval within 10 business days after the PO is awarded. The project shall be completely done within four weekends from the start date, with working hours during weekends and holidays. A tentative start date is on May 3, 2025. Any delays shall be communicated promptly.

B.6 WARRANTY

The contractor shall provide a one-year warranty on the materials and workmanship for the new HVAC systems. The contractor shall provide onsite repairs when problem or failure was notified.

B.7 SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

The contractor is responsible for ensuring all work is conducted safely and that the worksite is secure. Activity Hazard Analysis (AHA) documents shall be submitted for approval prior to commencing the work.

Co-operation and Making Good:

The Contractor shall submit an investigation/construction program in writing to the COR at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of possession of the site. The program should show the sequence of work and the periods within the various stages of the work are to be executed.

The Contractor shall perform the work within minimum disturbance to the building occupants, and the normal services and operation of the Embassy shall not be obstructed by the Contractor's work.

All work shall be equal in kind, quality and finish to that expected for high quality international standard.

Where the work affects occupied portions of a building, the Contractor shall ensure continuity of building services and necessary access for personnel and vehicles.

Meetings:

The Embassy or the Contractor may request a meeting (either on-site or off-site) to clarify any part of this contract. The project manager, Contractor's superintendent, COR, and other required persons will normally attend.

The Contractor will keep minutes of every meeting and provide written copies (within two working days) to the COR for approval.

Project Schedules:

Format:

- Prepare schedules as horizontal bar chart with separate bar for each major portion of Work or operation, identifying first workday of each week.
- Sequence of Listing: Chronological order of start of each item of Work.
- Scale and Spacing: To provide space for notations and revisions.

Content:

- Show complete sequence of construction by activity, with dates for beginning and completion of each element of construction.
- Identify each item by Specification Section number.
- Provide sub-schedules for each stage of work.
- Provide sub-schedules to define critical portions of entire Schedule.
- Coordinate content with Schedule of Values.
- Submit schedule allowing for a 30-day review prior to commencing.

Revision to Schedules:

- Indicate progress of each activity to date of submittal and projected completion date of each activity.
- Identify activities modified since previous submittal, major changes in scope, and other identifiable changes.
- Provide narrative report to define problem areas, anticipated delays, and impact on Schedule. Report corrective action taken, or proposed, and its effect.

Submittals:

- Submit initial Schedules within thirty (30) days after date of Notice to Proceed. After review, resubmit required revised data within ten days.
- Submit revised Progress Schedules with each Application for Payment.

Distribution:

- Distribute copies of reviewed Schedules to project site file, sub-Contractors, suppliers, and other concerned parties.
- Instruct recipients to promptly report, in writing, problems anticipated by projections indicated in Schedules.

Site Visit (Bid Conference):

The bidders who are interested to submit their proposals shall meet with the COR at 3rd and 5th Floor, Tower A, GPF Building, 93/1 Wireless Rd. Lumpini, Pathumwan, Bangkok, Thailand 10330.

The site visit shall be scheduled and confirmed by Facility Management through Contracting Officer Representative.

Access to the work site:

The Contractor shall permit the Facilities Manager and COR or any officer authorized by the COR to have access to the work at all times during the execution of work.

The Contractor superintendent shall meet daily with the COR (unless waived by the COR) to review progress and plans.

Power Supply, Water and temporary services:

The Embassy will supply free of charge temporary power supply and water for construction proposes. The Contractor is responsible for furnishing and installing temporary services.

- The electricity supply is located at: (to be discussed during the site survey)
- The water supply (non-potable) is located at: nearest water outlet(s) (to be discussed during the site survey)
- The water supply (potable) is located at: nearest potable water station (to be discussed during the site survey)

Temporary ladders, scaffolds, hoists:

Furnish and maintain temporary ramps, scaffolds, or hoists as required for proper execution of work.

Such apparatus, equipment, and construction shall meet requirement of applicable local safety and labor laws.

Safety:

- Welding and use of open flames in or adjacent to the Embassy properties requires approval from the Facilities Manager (or supervisor). Use of explosive actuated fastening devices shall not be used without the prior permission of the Facilities Manager.
- Observe and enforce all construction safety measures required by the Thai Labor Code, Local Building Codes, Workers Compensation Board, Municipal Statutes and Authorities. When conflict arises, the code or statute, which is more stringent, shall apply.
- If any personnel are injured, the Contractor has sole responsible for such injury.
- Powered equipment must be in good condition. Electrical and other utility connections must be properly made. Extension cords will be heavy-duty type suitable for the load involved.

Quality Control:

Maintain quality control over suppliers, manufacturers, products, services, site conditions, and workmanship to produce work of specified quality.

Examine each phase of work and have defective conditions corrected before starting subsequent operations, which include cover, or are dependent upon, work in question.

Utilize qualified personnel who have experience with the specified works to produce workmanship of specified quality. The Contractor personnel responsible for the project must qualify as described below:

- Senior engineer: A professional engineer in the related field occupies a second class (level 2-Professional Engineer) or higher issued by Board for the Control of the Engineering Profession, Thailand. Or other International Engineering License.
- Engineer: A professional engineer in the related field, occupies a third class (level 1-Associate Engineer) issued by Board for the Control of the Engineering Profession, Thailand. Or other International Engineering License.
- Foreman: A professional technician, high vocational or diploma education in related field.
- Site supervision personnel: The contractor shall submit a certificate of the site supervision personnel with a proposal (for technical evaluation).

The Contractor shall apply technical knowledge and specific equipment/tools for related work in the contract.

Temporary Fire Protection:

- During construction, the Contractor shall comply with fire safety practices as outlined in NFPA and local fire protection codes, and in addition:
- The Embassy requires portable fire extinguishers (stored pressure type, UL fire rating 10A:60B:C) to be readily available at all work sites during entire installation period.
- The Contractor is responsible for properly deploying the fire extinguishers to each work area occupied by the Contractor e.g. welding site, temporary structure, construction office, storage, tool, and workshop sheds. Proper deployment includes advising the COR on the number of fire extinguishers, transport to and from warehouse and work sites, worker training how to operate the fire extinguisher, etc.
- Contractor’s superintendent or other assistant superintendents shall be appointed as project fire warden for entire construction period.

Building Codes:

Perform all work in accordance with the Building Codes of Bangkok, (Electrical, Plumbing and all other codes that pertain to trades involved in this specification). In no instance shall meet a standard identified or established within this section be reduced without written permission from the Facilities Manager.

Sub-Contractor:

The awarded Contractor shall not assign this contract or any part of it without the written permission of the Facilities Manager.

No assignment of the contract shall relieve the Contractor from any obligation under the contract or impose any liability upon the Embassy or the Contracting Officer.

Working Hours:

The contractor shall be bound by religious and national holidays of common local observance. The Administrative Notice issued by the Embassy showing holidays is attached. The Contractor shall also be bound by the working hours customarily observed by the Embassy (07:00-16:00 hours from Monday thru Friday) of each week unless permitted by the COR.

Security regulations require a photocopy of the Thai ID card for each worker to be submitted to the COR at least one (1) week in advance. Workers must have same ID cards to enter the compound.

Security regulations require vehicle make type, color and license number for vehicles to enter the compound daily to be submitted to the COR at least 48 hours in advance.

All work performed will be under the observation of the COR. The COR will normally assign an escort to observe the day-to-day activities of the Contractor. Working hours must be approved at least two working days in advance to ensure the availability of the required escort.

Communications:

Where any notice, request, direction, or other communications is required, it shall be in writing. It shall be delivered in person, sent by registered mail, facsimile (FAX) or electronic mail to the COR.

Utility interruptions (gas, water, and electrical) require written notice at least one (1) week in advance.

Storage and Handling Materials/Equipment/Tools:

Special care should be given to handling and storing materials/equipment/tools. The ownership of the items is passed from the Contractor only upon acceptance by the COR. Equipment/tools not accepted by the COR is the Contractor's sole responsibility.

Protection:

The Contractor shall protect the work as its proceeds, protect the area, which is next to the construction, and protect the materials and components from damage and deterioration.

The Contractor shall provide barricades as required to protect natural resources, site improvements, existing property, adjacent property, and personnel.

Where pedestrian traffic is through or adjacent to work area, the Contractor shall provide necessary guardrails and barricades to protect pedestrians and to prevent pedestrian access to work areas.

Remove guardrails and barricades at completion of construction.

The Contractor shall submit proposed plan and details of staging area.

Unsuitable Workers:

Upon the request of the COR, the Contractor shall remove any person employed by him who, in the opinion of the COR, is incompetent or has conducted himself improperly. The Contractor shall not permit a person who has been removed to return to the work site.

Contractor's Liability:

The Contractor must have complete insurance coverage for any injuries or damages that may occur during the construction period.

Final Completion:

After completion of the work, the Contractor shall make an appointment with COR for inspection and final acceptance with the signature of COR. The work site and related areas must be in a clean and tidy condition.

SUBMITTALS

General:

For each part of work Specified in this Scope of Work, submit the following as applicable, in accordance with Contract Clauses and Conditions.

- The Contractor must include written specifications for the materials and a sample of each material (as required) along with his/her quotation.
- Submit shop drawings showing plans / elevations / sections at not smaller than scale 1:100, and details not smaller than scale 1:20.

Samples:

Submit physical examples to illustrate materials and workmanship; and to establish standards by which completed work is judged, if requested.

Contractor Responsibilities:

- Review shop drawings, material data, and samples prior to submission. Initial, sign, or stamp, certifying the Contractor's review of the submittal.
- Verify:
 - Field measurements.
 - Field construction criteria.
 - Catalog numbers and similar data.
- Coordinate each submittal with requirements of work and Contract Documents.
- Contractor's responsibility for errors and omissions in submittals is not relieved by COR review of submittals.
- Contractor's responsibility for deviations in submittals from requirements of Contract Documents is not relieved by the COR's review of submittals, unless COR gives written acceptance of specific deviations.
- Notify COR, in writing at time of submission, of deviations in submittals from requirements of Contract Documents.
- Begin no work, which requires submittals until return of submittals with COR's stamp and initials or signature indicating review and indication to proceed as noted. Work performed prior to submission and approval of submittals may be subject for rejection.
- Distribute copies after COR's approval.
- Provide submittal information data in English and dimensions in both metric and English units.

Submission Requirements:

- Schedule submissions to the COR immediately after Contract award.

SECTION D - INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE

The COR, or his/her authorized representatives, will inspect from time to time the services being performed and the supplies furnished to determine whether work is being performed in a satisfactory manner, and that all supplies are of acceptable quality and standards.

The Contractor shall be responsible for any countermeasures or corrective action, within the scope of this contract, which may be required by the Contracting Officer as a result of such inspection.

D.1 SUBSTANTIAL COMPLETION

(a) "*Substantial Completion*" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined and certified by the Contracting Officer in writing to the Contractor, on which the work (or a portion designated by the Government) is sufficiently complete and satisfactory. Substantial completion means that the property may be occupied or used for the purpose for which it is intended, and only minor items such as touch-up, adjustments, and minor replacements or installations remain to be completed or corrected which:

- (1) do not interfere with the intended occupancy or utilization of the work, and
- (2) can be completed or corrected within the time period required for final completion.

(b) The "date of substantial completion" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer or authorized Government representative as of which substantial completion of the work has been achieved.

Use and Possession upon Substantial Completion - The Government shall have the right to take possession of and use the work upon substantial completion. Upon notice by the Contractor that the work is substantially complete (a Request for Substantial Completion) and an inspection by the Contracting Officer or an authorized Government representative (including any required tests), the Contracting Officer shall furnish the Contractor a Certificate of Substantial Completion. The certificate will be accompanied by a Schedule of Defects listing items of work remaining to be performed, completed, or corrected before final completion and acceptance. Failure of the Contracting Officer to list any item of work shall not relieve the Contractor of responsibility for complying with the terms of the contract. The Government's possession or use upon substantial completion shall not be deemed an acceptance of any work under the contract.

D.2 FINAL COMPLETION AND ACCEPTANCE

D.2.1 "Final completion and acceptance" means the stage in the progress of the work as determined by the Contracting Officer and confirmed in writing to the Contractor, at which all work required under the contract has been completed in a satisfactory manner, subject to the discovery of defects after final completion, and except for items specifically excluded in the notice of final acceptance.

D.2.2 The "*date of final completion and acceptance*" means the date determined by the Contracting Officer when final completion of the work has been achieved, as indicated by written notice to the Contractor.

D.2.3 FINAL INSPECTION AND TESTS. The Contractor shall give the Contracting Officer at least five (5) days advance written notice of the date when the work will be fully completed and ready for final inspection and tests. Final inspection and tests will be started not later than the date specified in the notice unless the Contracting Officer determines that the work is not ready for final inspection and so informs the Contractor.

D.2.4 FINAL ACCEPTANCE. If the Contracting Officer is satisfied that the work under the contract is complete (with the exception of continuing obligations), the Contracting Officer shall issue to the Contractor a notice of final acceptance and make final payment upon:

- Satisfactory completion of all required tests,
- A final inspection that all items by the Contracting Officer listed in the Schedule of Defects have been completed or corrected and that the work is finally complete (subject to the discovery of defects after final completion), and
- Submittal by the Contractor of all documents and other items required upon completion of the work, including a final request for payment (Request for Final Acceptance).

SECTION E - DELIVERIES AND PERFORMANCE

No extension of time shall be allowed due to delay by the Government in approving such deliverables if the Contractor has failed to act promptly and responsively in submitting its deliverables. The

Contractor shall identify each deliverable as required by the contract.

(e) Acceptance of Schedule: When the Government has accepted any time schedule; it shall be binding upon the Contractor. The completion date is fixed and may be extended only by a written contract modification signed by the Contracting Officer. Acceptance or approval of any schedule or revision thereof by the Government shall not:

- (1) Extend the completion date or obligate the Government to do so,
- (2) Constitute acceptance or approval of any delay, or
- (3) Excuse the Contractor from or relieve the Contractor of its obligation to maintain the progress of the work and achieve final completion by the established completion date.

NOTICE OF DELAY

If the Contractor receives a notice of any change in the work, or if any other conditions arise which are likely to cause or are actually causing delays which the Contractor believes may result in late completion of the project, the Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer. The Contractor's notice shall state the effect, if any, of such change or other conditions upon the approved schedule, and shall state in what respects, if any, the relevant schedule, or the completion date should be revised. The Contractor shall give such notice promptly, not more than ten (10) days after the first event giving rise to the delay or prospective delay. Only the Contracting Officer may revise the approved time schedule.

NOTICE TO PROCEED

(a) After receiving and accepting any bonds or evidence of insurance, the Contracting Officer will provide the Contractor a Notice to Proceed. The Contractor must then prosecute the work, commencing and completing performance not later than the time period established in the contract.

(b) It is possible that the Contracting Officer may elect to issue the Notice to Proceed before receipt and acceptance of any bonds or evidence of insurance. Issuance of a Notice to Proceed by the Government before receipt of the required bonds or insurance certificates or policies shall not be a waiver of the requirement to furnish these documents.

PRECONSTRUCTION CONFERENCE

A preconstruction conference will be held 10 days after contract award with the Facility Management office to discuss the schedule, submittals, notice to proceed, mobilization and other important issues that affect construction progress. See FAR 52.236-26, Preconstruction Conference.

SECTION G - SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

G.1.0 PERFORMANCE/PAYMENT PROTECTION - The Contractor shall furnish some form of payment protection as described in 52.228-13 in the amount of 20% of the contract price.

G.1.1 The Contractor shall provide the information required by the paragraph above within ten (10) calendar days after award. Failure to timely submit the required security may result in rescinding or termination of the contract by the Government. If the contract is terminated, the Contractor will be liable for those costs as described in FAR 52.249-10, Default (Fixed-Price Construction), which is included in this purchase order.

G.1.2 The bonds or alternate performance security shall guarantee the Contractor's execution and completion of the work within the contract time. This security shall also guarantee the correction of any defects after completion, the payment of all wages and other amounts payable by the Contractor under its subcontracts or for labor and materials, and the satisfaction or removal of any liens or encumbrances placed on the work.

G.1.3 The required securities shall remain in effect in the full amount required until final acceptance of the project by the Government. Upon final acceptance, the penal sum of the performance security shall be reduced to 10% of the contract price. The security shall remain in effect for one year after the date of final completion and acceptance, and the Contractor shall pay any premium required for the entire period of coverage.

G.2.2 The foregoing types and amounts of insurance are the minimums required. The Contractor shall obtain any other types of insurance required by local law or that are ordinarily or customarily obtained in the location of the work. The limit of such insurance shall be as provided by law or sufficient to meet normal and customary claims.

G.2.3 The Contractor agrees that the Government shall not be responsible for personal injuries or for damages to any property of the Contractor, its officers, agents, servants, and employees, or any other person, arising from and incident to the Contractor's performance of this contract. The Contractor shall hold harmless and indemnify the Government from any and all claims arising therefrom, except in the instance of gross negligence on the part of the Government.

G.2.4 The Contractor shall obtain adequate insurance for damage to, or theft of, materials and equipment in insurance coverage for loose transit to the site or in storage on or off the site.

G.2.5 The general liability policy required of the Contractor shall name "the United States of America, acting by and through the Department of State", as an additional insured with respect to operations performed under this contract.

G.3.0 DOCUMENT DESCRIPTIONS

G.3.1 SUPPLEMENTAL DOCUMENTS: The Contracting Officer shall furnish from time to time such detailed drawings and other information as is considered necessary, in the opinion of the Contracting Officer, to interpret, clarify, supplement, or correct inconsistencies, errors or omissions in the Contract documents, or to describe minor changes in the work not involving an increase in the contract price or extension of the contract time. The Contractor shall comply with the requirements of the supplemental documents, and unless prompt objection is made by the Contractor within 20 days, their issuance shall not provide for any claim for an increase in the Contract price or an extension of contract time.

G.3.1.1. RECORD DOCUMENTS. The Contractor shall maintain at the project site:

- (1) a current marked set of Contract drawings and specifications indicating all interpretations and clarification, contract modifications, change orders, or any other departure from the contract requirements approved by the Contracting Officer; and,
- (2) a complete set of record shop drawings, product data, samples and other submittals as approved by the Contracting Officer.

G.3.1.2. "As-Built" Documents: After final completion of the work, but before final acceptance thereof, the Contractor shall provide:

G.4.0 LAWS AND REGULATIONS - The Contractor shall, without additional expense to the Government, be responsible for complying with all laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations applicable to the performance of the work, including those of the host country, and with the

lawful orders of any governmental authority having jurisdiction. Host country authorities may not enter the project site without the permission of the Regional Security Office. Unless otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer, the Contractor shall comply with the more stringent of the requirements of such laws, regulations, and orders and of the contract. In the event of a conflict between the contract and such laws, regulations and orders, the Contractor shall promptly advise the Contracting Officer of the conflict and of the Contractor's proposed course of action for resolution by the Contracting Officer.

G.4.1 The Contractor shall comply with all local labor laws, regulations, customs, and practices pertaining to labor, safety, and similar matters, to the extent that such compliance is not inconsistent with the requirements of this contract.

G.4.2 The Contractor shall give written assurance to the Contracting Officer that all subcontractors and others performing work on or for the project have obtained all requisite licenses and permits.

G.4.3 The Contractor shall submit proper documentation and evidence satisfactory to the Contracting Officer of compliance with this clause.

G.5.0 CONSTRUCTION PERSONNEL - The Contractor shall maintain discipline at the site and at all times take all reasonable precautions to prevent any unlawful, riotous, or disorderly conduct by or among those employed at the site. The Contractor shall ensure the preservation of peace and protection of persons and property in the neighborhood of the project against such action. The Contracting Officer may require, in writing that the Contractor remove from the work any employee that the Contracting Officer deems incompetent, careless, insubordinate or otherwise objectionable, or whose continued employment on the project is deemed by the Contracting Officer to be contrary to the Government's interests.

G.5.1 If the Contractor has knowledge that any actual or potential labor dispute is delaying or threatens to delay the timely performance of this contract, the Contractor shall immediately give notice, including all relevant information, to the Contracting Officer.

G.5.2 After award, the Contractor has ten calendar days to submit to the Contracting Officer a list of workers and supervisors assigned to this project for the Government to conduct all necessary security checks. It is anticipated that security checks will take 10-15 days to perform. For each individual, the list shall include:

- Current Address
- Identification number

Failure to provide any of the above information may be considered grounds for rejection and/or resubmittal of the application. Once the Government has completed the security screening and approved the applicants a badge will be provided to the individual for access to the site. This

G.5.3 The Contractor shall provide an English speaking supervisor on site at all times. This position is considered as key personnel under this purchase order.

G.6.0 Materials and Equipment - All materials and equipment incorporated into the work shall be new and for the purpose intended, unless otherwise specified. All workmanship shall be of good quality and performed in a skillful manner that will withstand inspection by the Contracting Officer.

G.7.0 SPECIAL WARRANTIES

G.7.1 Any special warranties that may be required under the contract shall be subject to the stipulations set forth in 52.246-21, "Warranty of Construction", as long as they are not in conflict.

G.7.2 The Contractor shall obtain and furnish to the Government all information required to make any subcontractor's, manufacturer's, or supplier's guarantee or warranty legally binding and effective. The Contractor shall submit both the information and the guarantee or warranty to the Government in sufficient time to permit the Government to meet any time limit specified in the guarantee or warranty, but not later than completion and acceptance of all work under this contract.

G.8.0 EQUITABLE ADJUSTMENTS

Any circumstance for which the contract provides an equitable adjustment that causes a change within the meaning of paragraph (a) of the "Changes" clause shall be treated as a change under that clause; provided, that the Contractor gives the Contracting Officer prompt written notice (within 20 days) stating:

Covered foreign country means The People’s Republic of China.

Covered telecommunications equipment or services means—

(1) Telecommunications equipment produced by Huawei Technologies Company or ZTE Corporation (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities);

(2) For the purpose of public safety, security of Government facilities, physical security surveillance of critical infrastructure, and other national security purposes, video surveillance and telecommunications equipment produced by Hytera Communications Corporation, Hangzhou Hikvision Digital Technology Company, or Dahua Technology Company (or any subsidiary or affiliate of such entities);

(3) Telecommunications or video surveillance services provided by such entities or using such equipment; or

(4) Telecommunications or video surveillance equipment or services produced or provided by an entity that the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the Director of National Intelligence or the Director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, reasonably believes to be an entity owned or controlled by, or otherwise connected to, the government of a covered foreign country.

Critical technology means—

(1) Defense articles or defense services included on the United States Munitions List set forth in the International Traffic in Arms Regulations under subchapter M of chapter I of title 22, Code of Federal Regulations;

(2) Items included on the Commerce Control List set forth in Supplement No. 1 to part 774 of the Export Administration Regulations under subchapter C of chapter VII of title 15, Code of Federal Regulations, and controlled-

(i) Pursuant to multilateral regimes, including for reasons relating to national security, chemical and biological weapons proliferation, nuclear nonproliferation, or missile technology; or

(ii) For reasons relating to regional stability or surreptitious listening;

(3) Specially designed and prepared nuclear equipment, parts and components, materials, software, and technology covered by part 810 of title 10, Code of Federal Regulations (relating to assistance to foreign atomic energy activities);

(4) Nuclear facilities, equipment, and material covered by part 110 of title 10, Code of Federal Regulations (relating to export and import of nuclear equipment and material);

(5) Select agents and toxins covered by part 331 of title 7, Code of Federal Regulations, part 121 of title 9 of such Code, or part 73 of title 42 of such Code; or

(6) Emerging and foundational technologies controlled pursuant to section 1758 of the Export Control Reform Act of 2018 (50 U.S.C. 4817).

Interconnection arrangements means arrangements governing the physical connection of two or more networks to allow the use of another's network to hand off traffic where it is ultimately delivered (e.g., connection of a customer of telephone provider A to a customer of telephone company B) or sharing data and other information resources.

Reasonable inquiry means an inquiry designed to uncover any information in the entity's possession about the identity of the producer or provider of covered telecommunications equipment or services used by the entity that excludes the need to include an internal or third-party audit.

Roaming means cellular communications services (e.g., voice, video, data) received from a visited network when unable to connect to the facilities of the home network either because signal coverage is too weak or because traffic is too high.

Substantial or essential component means any component necessary for the proper function or performance of a piece of equipment, system, or service.

(b) *Prohibition.*

(1) Section 889(a)(1)(A) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (Pub. L. 115-232) prohibits the head of an executive agency on or after August 13, 2019, from procuring or obtaining, or extending or renewing a contract to procure or obtain, any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system. The Contractor is prohibited from providing to the Government any equipment, system, or

service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system, unless an exception at paragraph (c) of this clause applies or the covered telecommunication equipment or services are covered by a waiver described in FAR [4.2104](#).

(2) Section 889(a)(1)(B) of the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019 (Pub. L. 115-232) prohibits the head of an executive agency on or after August 13, 2020, from entering into a contract, or extending or renewing a contract, with an entity that uses any equipment, system, or service that uses covered telecommunications equipment or services as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system, unless an exception at paragraph (c) of this clause applies or the covered telecommunication equipment or services are covered by a waiver described in FAR [4.2104](#). This prohibition applies to the use of covered telecommunications equipment or services, regardless of whether that use is in performance of work under a Federal contract.

(c) *Exceptions*. This clause does not prohibit contractors from providing—

(1) A service that connects to the facilities of a third-party, such as backhaul, roaming, or interconnection arrangements; or

(2) Telecommunications equipment that cannot route or redirect user data traffic or permit visibility into any user data or packets that such equipment transmits or otherwise handles.

(d) Reporting requirement.

(1) In the event the Contractor identifies covered telecommunications equipment or services used as a substantial or essential component of any system, or as critical technology as part of any system, during contract performance, or the Contractor is notified of such by a subcontractor at any tier or by any other source, the Contractor shall report the information in paragraph (d)(2) of this clause to the Contracting Officer, unless elsewhere in this contract are established procedures for reporting the information; in the case of the Department of Defense, the Contractor shall report to the website at <https://dibnet.dod.mil>. For indefinite delivery contracts, the Contractor shall report to the Contracting Officer for the indefinite delivery contract and the Contracting Officer(s) for any affected order or, in the case of the Department of Defense, identify both the indefinite delivery contract and any affected orders in the report provided at <https://dibnet.dod.mil>.

(2) The Contractor shall report the following information pursuant to paragraph (d)(1) of this clause

(i) Within one business day from the date of such identification or notification: the contract number; the order number(s), if applicable; supplier name; supplier unique entity identifier (if known); supplier Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) code (if known); brand; model number (original equipment manufacturer number, manufacturer part number, or wholesaler number); item description; and any readily available information about mitigation actions undertaken or recommended.

(ii) Within 10 business days of submitting the information in paragraph (d)(2)(i) of this clause: any further available information about mitigation actions undertaken or recommended. In addition, the Contractor shall describe the efforts it undertook to prevent use or submission of covered telecommunications equipment or services, and any additional efforts that will be incorporated to prevent future use or submission of covered telecommunications equipment or services.

(e) *Subcontracts*. The Contractor shall insert the substance of this clause, including this paragraph (e) and excluding paragraph (b)(2), in all subcontracts and other contractual instruments, including subcontracts for the acquisition of commercial products or commercial services.

In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall immediately stop all work hereunder and shall immediately cause any and all of its suppliers and subcontractors to cease work. Subject to the terms of this contract, the Contractor shall be paid a percentage of the contract price reflecting the percentage of the work performed prior to the notice of termination, plus reasonable charges that the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government, using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred that reasonably could have been avoided.

(g) *Termination for cause.* The Government may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the Contractor, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the Government, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the Government shall not be liable to the Contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the Contractor shall be liable to the Government for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the Government improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.

The term also includes an item brought to the site preassembled from articles, materials, or supplies. However, emergency lifesafety systems, such as emergency lighting, fire alarm, and audio evacuation systems, that are discrete systems incorporated into a public building or work and that are produced as complete systems, are evaluated as a single and distinct construction material regardless of when or how the individual parts or components of those systems are delivered to the construction site.

L.7. 52.225-20 PROHIBITION ON CONDUCTING RESTRICTED BUSINESS OPERATIONS IN SUDAN – CERTIFICATION (AUG 2009)

(a) *Definitions.* As used in this provision—

“Business operations” means engaging in commerce in any form, including by acquiring, developing, maintaining, owning, selling, possessing, leasing, or operating equipment, facilities, personnel, products, services, personal property, real property, or any other apparatus of business or commerce.

“Marginalized populations of Sudan” means—

(1) Adversely affected groups in regions authorized to receive assistance under section 8(c) of the Darfur Peace and Accountability Act (Pub. L. 109-344) (50 U.S.C. 1701 note); and

(2) Marginalized areas in Northern Sudan described in section 4(9) of such Act.

“Restricted business operations” means business operations in Sudan that include power production activities, mineral extraction activities, oil-related activities, or the production of military equipment, as those terms are defined in the Sudan Accountability and Divestment Act of 2007 (Pub. L. 110-174). Restricted business operations do not include business operations that the person conducting the business can demonstrate—

(1) Are conducted under contract directly and exclusively with the regional government of southern Sudan;

(2) Are conducted pursuant to specific authorization from the Office of Foreign Assets Control in the Department of the Treasury, or are expressly exempted under Federal law from the requirement to be conducted under such authorization;

(3) Consist of providing goods or services to marginalized populations of Sudan;

(4) Consist of providing goods or services to an internationally recognized peacekeeping force or humanitarian organization;

(5) Consist of providing goods or services that are used only to promote health or education; or

(6) Have been voluntarily suspended.
